COURSE DESCRIPTION

AP Statistics is designed to introduce students to the major concepts and tools for collecting, analyzing and drawing conclusions from data. Students who successfully complete the course and AP examination may receive credit, advanced placement, or both for a one-semester introductory college statistics course. College credit for the course (PSY-K300) may also be earned through the Advance College Project in affiliation with Indiana University.

GENERAL COURSE GOALS

- Explore, organize and describe data using graphs and numerical summaries
- Explore methods for producing data that can give clear answers to specific questions
- Use probability to describe chance, variation and risk to separate reality from background noise
- Draw conclusions about a wider universe while realizing that variation is everywhere and that conclusions are uncertain
