Welcome to class. You have picked a great year to be enrolled in AP Statistics. Not only will you receive great instruction and preparation for college, but you are automatically enrolled in the AP TIP IN grant program. This grant is funded with federal Investing in Innovation (i3) funds under the umbrella of the National Math and Science Initiative and is facilitated by the University of Notre Dame. The grant provides training for teachers and free test preparation for students in addition to cash bonuses for qualifying scores. ©

Student test preparation will come in two forms:

- 1. Structured Tutoring Time. I will offer review sessions from 7:30 AM to 8:30 AM on every morning of a test day.
- 2. AP Student Conferences (APSC). These conferences will be held on three Saturdays during the year. Sessions on English, Math, and Science topics will be offered each of the three Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. If you are only enrolled in one of the three AP subjects, you are required to attend four of the fifty-five minute sessions offered. If you are enrolled in more than one of the AP subjects, you will want to plan to attend all six sessions during the day. You will be able to select and attend those sessions that address your need for additional instruction. These sessions will provide you with time to work with experts and AP TIP IN Statistic teachers to prepare for the free response and multiple choice sections of the test. As an added bonus for attendance at each APSC, you will be provided with lunch and you will have a chance to win attendance prizes!
